#### **RULES:**

- 1. Photos to be handed in to Waimate Library by Wednesday 9 Feb 4 PM
- 2. All Photos must have the Exhibitors name and class number on the reverse
- 3. All photo to be 150mm x 100mm, with no border, except the montage class.
- 4. **ALL OTHER** Entries to be advised no later than **11 am** on Thursday prior to the show.
- 5. All exhibits in Sections 1,2,3 and 4 are to be grown in the EXHIBITORS OWN GARDEN.
- 6. All exhibits MUST be the EXHIBITORS OWN WORK.
- 7. Vases are supplied for Sections 1 & 2.
- 8. In Section 3, Vegetables, entries are limited to 2 of the same variety. An exhibitor may enter additional varieties in the same class, provided they are labelled.
- 9. Entries in all other classes are limited to a maximum of 6 per class.
- 10. Exhibits may be removed between 4 and 4:30pm after the show has closed.
- 11. Exhibits not removed by 4:30pm will be removed/stored at the organising committee's discretion.

POINTS: Points will be allocated as follows: 1st: 5, 2nd: 3, 3rd: 1 point
